Introducing: Timothy Phillips - "Ahoy to all of the Lt. Cmdr. Lea Camp 2. I have to thank Chap



Traylor and David LaBrot for finding a camp that would answer my emails. I started rooting through the family woodpile about 1970 and discovered my dad had spent his time at Aberdeen Proving Ground and Guadalcanal fighting for the wrong side of the Civil War. His grandpa was Federal Pvt. William R. Phillips, orderly to Capt. Harry Hodges of Co. B, 6th Tennessee Cavalry. The family has been around Abilene since about 1883.

I am a clinical scientist at a local medical center, but have become obsessed with living history since joining the Old Fort Griffin Memorial Regiment about 6 years ago. My primary impression with them is 11th Infantry camp life ca. 1874. The Civil War interest mushroomed when a group of us participated in the 145th Gettysburg and I got busy studying that battle. I've also become irritated at the neighborhood Confeds trying to rewrite history at some events. And I hope with the SUVCW to help preserve history as it was, not the politically sanitized stuff I've seen in school books. Finally, it's really neat having an ancestor in central Tennessee that made the right decision. Look forward to seeing you down the road." Welcome, Brother Phillips!

Introducing: William C. Buell - I join as a new member based on the Civil War service of my greatgrandfather, Matthias Stonebrook, who served as a Private with Company F, 22nd Battalion, 142nd Regiment, Ohio Volunteer Infantry. I was born in Mt Vernon, Ohio on 1 January 1934. I am married with a son and two granddaughters who live in Carmel, New York; a daughter and two grandsons who live in Bristol, England; and a daughter and a grandson and granddaughter who live in Vienna, Virginia.

I was a professional soldier and later an educator. I served in the U.S. Army in an enlisted capacity between 1952 and 1955, including a year in Korea - as a Corporal and then Sergeant. Four years later, I graduated from West Point as a 2nd Lieutenant of Artillery and served for 23 additional years - retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel. My overseas service included 2 tours in Viet Nam, a year in Spain, a short tour in Germany, a year in Panama, 3 years in the Dominican Republic, and, Oh Yes! 3 years in Hawaii. My Army career was exceptional in that I never worked for anyone who was stupid and I never had an assignment I didn't like. I also accumulated, among other items, 3 decorations for Valor and a Purple Heart.

Upon my retirement in 1981, my wife and I settled in San Antonio, Texas where she was employed as a



Department of the Army Civilian at Fort Sam Houston, and I, through the machinations of fate, became a Spanish Teacher at a College Prep High School. At the conclusion of my first year teaching, I became the Dean of Academics, and shortly thereafter the Vice Principal - jobs I held for the next fifteen years. However, I never let my administrative duties keep me out of the class room and continued to teach at least 2 classes every day. In addition to Spanish, I taught Latin and even Russian one year. Again, like my military career, my career as a High School Educator, was tremendously rewarding and enjoyable. I am retired, living in San Antonio, Texas and my main hobbies are genealogy and tennis. hereditary societies including: Mayflower; Founders & Patriots; Colonial Wars; SAR; and War of 1812. Currently, I am the Registrar of the Huguenot Society Chapter of South Texas.

I have always been fascinated with military history, but as a West Pointer, the Civil War has a much deeper and intense meaning for

me! Also, my great-great-uncle, Lieutenant Colonel Frederick M. Follett, also a West Pointer, was Chief of Union Artillery during the expedition to capture Norfolk - May 1862; and at the Siege of Suffolk, Virginia in January 1863; Commander of the Artillery Brigade, Army of the James, in operations about the Bermuda Hundred, June-August 1864; Battery Commander in the Richmond Campaign August 1864-April 1865 and at the Siege of Petersburg, August-September 1864. *Welcome, Brother Buell!*

Introducing: Stephen F. Duncan - Dr. Stephen F. Duncan was born in Oklahoma City on December

8, 1961 and raised in Lawton Oklahoma. His father, H.C. Duncan served in the USN during WWII, his grandfather, Fred Duncan, served as a combat engineer in U.S. Army in France during the First World War. His great-great grandfather, Isaac Duncan, served as a Private in Co. M of the 4th Missouri Cavalry (Militia).

Dr. Duncan graduated first in his class at MacArthur High School in Lawton in 1980. He graduated from college in 1983 summa cum laude with a degree in Sacred Music. He subsequently graduated in 1984 with a BME (also summa cum laude) and a Masters in Music Education in 1987. He attended Moreau Seminary at the University of Notre Dame, studying for the Roman Catholic priesthood, but left the Congregation of Holy Cross to return to Oklahoma and teach music. Offered a full time teaching assistantship at the University of



Memphis, he went to Memphis in 1987 and pursued a degree in sacred Music while working for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Memphis as director of Liturgical Music.

Dr. Duncan has been an active member of the *Society for Ethnomusicology* for many years serving as President, and Secretary of the Southwest Chapter, Secretary of the Southern Plains Chapter, and Associate Webmaster for Education on the National SEM Website. Dr. Duncan became interested in Russian music while working at Saints Constantine and Helen Serbian Orthodox Church in Galveston, Texas. He is the Director of Fine Arts for the Galveston Independent School District and adjunct Professor of Music at Galveston College.

During the 150th Anniversary of the Civil War, Dr. Duncan finally has had a chance to become an active historical re-enactor. His unit, the 69th NYSV (Corby's Irish Brigade), takes part in numerous re-enactments. He participated with the 69th at Bull Run, and has been invited to march with the 69th in the Annual NYC Saint Patrick's Day Parade. Dr. Duncan serves in a number of civic and religious organizations: Archpriest and Vicar Apostolic for the Diocese of the Pacific Coast (for his Jacobite jurisdiction); Church Chanter, Saints Constantine and Helen Serbian Orthodox Church, Galveston; Board of Directors of the Galveston Railroad Museum; Sgt. at Arms for the Galveston Rotary Club; Advisory Board Galveston Art Center; Chaplain, 69th NYSV Historical Association (The Irish Brigade); Society for Ethnomusicology (with academic books on the shelves of Harvard and Yale); Memphis Tia Piah Society (Kiowa Tia Piah Society of Oklahoma); and Huntsville (TX) Reenactment Society.

Introducing: Terry T. Sutton - "My name is Terry Sutton. I'm originally From

Corpus Christi, Texas. However I've lived in Seabrook, Texas for the last 30 years. I'm a graduate of Texas A&M University Class of 1986, BS - Geology, and have worked as a NASA contractor for 20 years. I've been researching my family history for about 10 years and have been successful in researching my father's side of the family back to 1635.

At the conclusion of the services at the Houston National Cemetery, the group made their way downtown to the Spaghetti Warehouse on Commerce Street for lunch and camaraderie.

Following lunch, the Color Guard and *Ladies Auxiliary* re-convened at Glenwood Cemetery on Washington Avenue in Houston. They were joined by Brothers Curtiss Beinhorn, Jim Hackett, and Dale Leach – and Sister Betty Hampton of the *Ladies Auxiliary*. They assembled first at the GAR plot where Sarah Emma Seeyle and several other Civil War veterans are buried.
